WHEREAS, the City of South Sioux City, Nebraska (hereinafter "City") requests use of the U.S Department of Energy – Energy Efficiency and Conservative Block Grant (EECBG) Program formula funds as allocated to Dakota County, Nebraska; and

Total road maintenance- 316 hours; culvert/road projects- 13 hours S Bluff Rd, 4.5 hours Gateway Dr, 7 hours Fiddler Creek and 10 hours N Bluff Rd; gravel hauling- 66 hours; total tons hauled- 878.68; sign repair/ barricading- 11 hours. Gravel concerns- 265th St. Some culvert work will be done north of the Homer shop; the 2 new pickups were picked up, Big Iron surplus list sold, waiting for check. Jackson High Bridge was graffitied and will be taken care of. Discussion on trees in county right of way on 142nd Street.

Commissioner Love moved, seconded by Commissioner Hohenstein to approve the Civil Engineers & Constructors LLC proposal for topographic mapping and survey fees for LikUWanta paving project. ROLL CALL VOTE: Hohenstein-yes, Launsby-yes, Giese-yes, Love-yes, Van Berkum-yes. UNANIMOUS MOTION CARRIED.

ARPA projects discussed.

Rodney Soole, Building and Grounds, explained there are 6 different sections around the courthouse that need to be replaced due to ADA compliance/tripping hazards. Two quotes were received EV Contracting Concrete, Excavation & Demolition - \$15,230.00 and Concrete Plus - \$22,821.00. Commissioner Love moved to approve EV Contracting. Commissioner Van Berkum asked that EV Contracting quote be approved provided they are clear on what needs to be done. No Second. Motion failed. Commissioner Van Berkum moved, seconded by Commissioner Giese to approve EV Contracting Concrete, Excavation & Demolition provided they are clear on what needs to be done for the quoted price of \$15,230.00. ROLL CALL VOTE: Launsby-yes, Giese-yes, Love-yes, Van Berkum-yes, Hohenstein-yes. UNANIMOUS MOTION CARRIED.

Discussion on purchasing property in front of County Road Shop of 1.357 acres. Jolene Gubbels provided a map of the property for clarification. Commissioner Love has been in contact with the property owner and is waiting to hear back from them. Should the County purchase this property, a culvert and road will need to be put in to give them access to their field.

Courthouse tree removal. Commissioner Giese proposes the 6 trees in front of the courthouse be removed and replaced with some healthy trees. The trees are old, cracking and continue to lose branches. Two quotes were received: JS Brothers Tree Service-\$4500 and Jeff's Tree Service-\$5500. Further discussion was had and at the least the cracked tree needs to be taken down. Some research needs to be done on the best trees to replace them with. Commissioner Giese moved, seconded by Commissioner Launsby to approve the trees to be removed and award the bid to JS Brothers Inc. Tree Service for \$4500.00.
